The officiant says to the people,



Watermain Replacement Construction UPDATE

Please be advised that the City of Lethbridge will be replacing the water main along 11St. S from 3 Ave to 6 Ave S. between May 21st and the end of September. At St. Augustine's, we will be impacted beginning on **June 17** as they begin to work on the intersection of 4 Ave. and 11 St. continue in front of the church to 5 Ave S. The pedestrian walkways will remain open and an accessible ramp will be constructed on the corner of 4 Avenue and 11st (north side of the church) and there will be *No Parking* signs put up so that easy drop off can happen along that side of the church during construction. No parking will be available along our block on 11 St. during that time.
